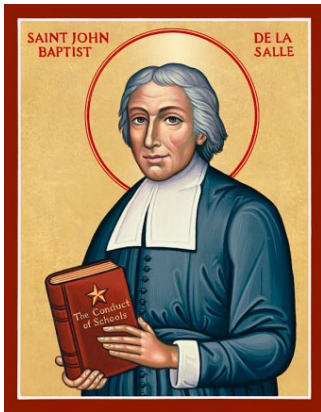




2020-2021 FACT SHEET
