



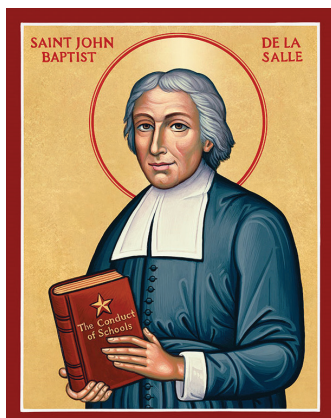
2022-2023 FACT SHEET

Admissions

- Admission to La Salle is primarily based on school records and standardized test scores from the 6th, 7th and 8th grades and TACHS (Test for Admission into Catholic High Schools) results.
- La Salle Academy's TACHS Code is **107**.
- Online 9th grade application is required in addition to middle school transcripts, an essay, and two letters of recommendation.
